The Case Management Pilot Project (CMPP) is a federally funded program that provides voluntary, trauma-informed, and culturally competent case management and related services to asylum-seekers and other noncitizens in ICE Alternatives to Detention Programs. 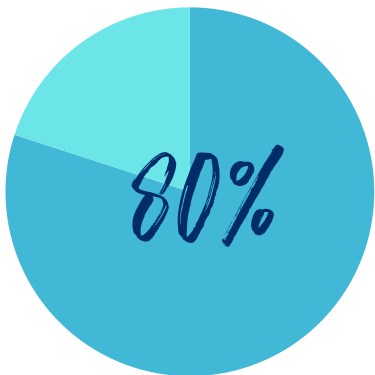

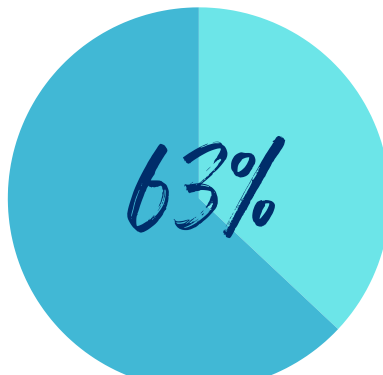

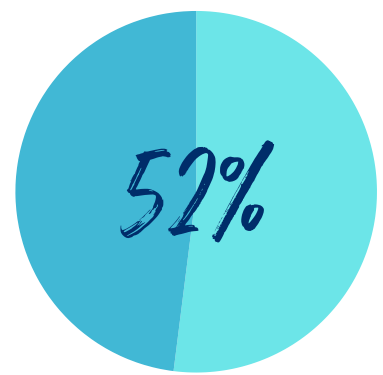
Mental Health
